Paracord Remembrance Poppy

Materials

- Red paracord (30 inches)
- Black paracord (20 inches)
- Green paracord (25 inches)
- Scissors
- Lighter

Tip: Make your knots as tight as possible with no loose cord.

1. Use the red cord to tie a two strand turk's head woggle. (Appendix 1)



2. Flatten out the woggle, keeping both loose ends on one side. Pull the sides out to create a hole in the centre.



3. Cut the extra cord and burn and seal the two ends together.



4. Use the black cord and tie a lanyard knot. (Appendix 2)



5. Carefully (don't let the top loop go through the knot) thread the loop through to create a button. (Appendix 2)



6. Use the green cord to tie a cobra knot. (Appendix 3)



7. Cut the extra cord and burn and seal the ends.



8. Thread the black cord ends through the centre of the red.



9. Thread the black cord ends through the loop in the green cord.



10. Tie the end of the black cord in a granny knot.




11. Cut the remaining cord and burn and seal the ends together.



12. Congratulations, you now have a poppy!



If the loop at the rear is kept as small as possible and the slack then worked carefully through the knot, you can have an elegant button, even better if doubled.






